SUBJECT: APPROVAL OF ONE FISCAL YEAR 2021-2022 HOUSING OPPORTUNITIES FOR PERSONS WITH AIDS SUBRECIPIENT CONTRACT RENEWAL WITH THE SALVATION ARMY – MABEE SOCIAL SERVICES CENTER – HIV ADMINISTRATIVE AGENCY

COMMISSIONERS COURT ACTION REQUESTED:

It is requested that Commissioners Court approve one (1) FY 2021-2022 Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA) subrecipient contract renewal with The Salvation Army – Mabee Social Services Center.

BACKGROUND:

On February 7, 2017, the Commissioners Court, through Court Order #124487, approved the FY 2017-2018 Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS) grant contract renewal that supports the Tarrant County's HOPWA program.

On December 5, 2017, the Commissioners Court, through Court Order #126665, approved Amendment No. 1 to the FY 2017-2018 Texas DSHS grant contract renewal that supports Tarrant County's HOPWA program, increasing the amount of funding by \$1,471.00, making the new total amount \$21,469.00.

On January 16, 2018, the Commissioners Court, through Court Order #126889, approved Amendment No. 2 to the FY 2018-2019 Texas DSHS grant contract that supports Tarrant County's HOPWA program in the amount of \$21,835.00.

On June 19, 2018, the Commissioners Court, through Court Order #127888, approved Amendment No. 3 to the FY 2018-2019 Texas DSHS grant contract that supports the Tarrant County's HOPWA program in the amount of \$274,021.00.

On December 11, 2018, the Commissioners Court, through Court Order #129203, approved Amendment No. 4 to the FY 2019-2020 Texas DSHS grant contract that supports Tarrant County's HOPWA program in the amount of \$301,423.00. The funding period was February 1, 2019 through January 31, 2020.

On January 14, 2020, the Commissioners Court, through Court Order #131917, approved Amendment No. 5 to the FY 2019-2020 Texas DSHS grant contract that supports arrant County's HOPWA program in the amount of \$385,853.00. The funding period was September 1, 2020 through August 31, 2021.

On April 28, 2020, the Commissioners Court, through Court Order #132669, approved Amendment No. 6 to the FY 2020-2021 Texas DSHS grant contract that supports Tarrant County's HOPWA program in the amount of \$289,173.00. The funding period was September 1, 2020 through August 31, 2021.

On June 2, 2020, the Commissioners Court, through Court Order #132912, approved Amendment No. 7 to the FY 2020-2021 Texas DSHS grant contract that supports Tarrant County's HOPWA program, increasing the amount of funding by \$25,000.00 for FY 2020. These funds were for the Coronavirus AID, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES) and were expended by August 31, 2020.

On April 27, 2021, the Commissioners Court, through Court Order #135311, approved Amendment No. 8 to the FY 2020-2021 Texas DSHS grant contract that supports Tarrant County's HOPWA program in the amount of \$294,956.00. The funding period is September 1, 2021 through August 31, 2022.

Tarrant County receives yearly support from Texas DSHS, in the form of grant contracts, to perform a variety of essential public health services. This grant contract renewal provides funding to support the provision of housing and support services as part of the HOPWA program. The term of the contract is September 1, 2021 through August 31, 2022.

The recommended contract renewal is as follows:

The Salvation Army – Mabee Social Services Center – Total reimbursement shall not exceed \$147,478.00.

The Criminal District Attorney's Office has reviewed these documents as to form.

FISCAL IMPACT:

All associated costs will be paid from grant fund allocations in grant account 569013/Grant-2004/1132200000/E0037-2022.
